





# A time to learn to love radically

In the letter to Hebrews, we read that we are called to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, to thousands of angels, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant (Hebrews 12:22ff). Therefore, let us begin our prayers in the heavenly places and experience everything we can from just being there. It is in this place where we see Jesus with our own eyes and make heart-felt contact directly with him and with the heavenly world, because our eyes and hearts belong first to God, and this relationship is not open to question but is very personal and not dependent on what we may hear from any other source. It is extremely important that our hearts be shaped by the atmosphere of heaven. Here in Zion is the place of prayer and here we live according to God's purposes for this world.

### The Lord calls us to seek His counsel and follow His guidance

God calls us to go higher, to the place of his decrees and purposes, because in intercession we must not allow ourselves to be drawn down to a human level. Otherwise, we run the risk of seeing a spiritual mandate also as a political goal. This was and is true for the Ukraine war and now also can be seen in the Middle East conflict. As a prayer network with a focus on politics and society, we have learned to pray as we are informed by the news. But let us all check for ourselves where we are driven primarily by the news and where we are also really seeking to meet God as we pray. We need a higher level of prayer and some independence from the reporting of news so that we do not become restless and troubled with the spirit of this world. It is God's wisdom that we seek. It is precisely because we live in a time of "wars and rumours of wars", wanting to take on responsibility in prayer, that we need a firm standing in God. We can only achieve this if we remain close to God's heart. During such a time of challenge in his life, Daniel set his heart on seeking God who came to him in a vision (Daniel 10). It is important that we know God personally. Knowing Him as our loving Father and Guide is the most important thing of all! It is not just knowing something about him, but being prepared to have fellowship with him and being intimate with him. We are often addicted to wanting information which is to some extent good and important, but is it not time we get to know God and His kingdom better and seek His wisdom more than anything else? Turning to Him transforms us (2 Corinthians 3:18).

# **Guarding our hearts**

We are called directly to be the at right hand of God in this world, just as Jesus was, and manifesting that position. The greatest thing to know is that God is love! God is calling us away from humanistic judgment and then taking one side or the other. There must be no such partisanship in our hearts if we want to contribute to transformation in our time. Jesus's kingdom is not of this world. It is therefore about moving away from our own judgment based on the eternal division between good versus evil, East versus West, Left versus Right, young versus old, black versus white, and so on. This in fact causes everyone to be against everyone else and everyone against themselves - each morally triggered by the conviction that one is completely right and morally superior to and wiser than the other person. This gets us nowhere! We need someone to manifest our plea for "oneness" in our prayers at this time.

#### Places of transformation

God invites us to let our hearts become places of transformation. Where do we still find hidden resentment in our hearts against someone without knowing why? It is when are our hearts not standing for the truth simply because they are actually full of fear and not founded on love? We need to understand more exactly why and how our hearts respond when challenged. God wants to take every such struggle out of our hearts so that we can welcome people and nations into our hearts, and God's kingdom as well as peace on earth can then grow in a way for all to see.

# **Global impact**

- For the reconciliation of the descendants of the brothers Isaac and Ishmael. Together with Messianic Jews and Arab Christians, we stand up for their peoples before God and as pioneers for the Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 19:23-25)
- Israel's military strength and intelligence services were overwhelmed in the Hamas attack. The West's political and economic strength was broken through in Russia's war against Ukraine. Let us cry out together to the Lord of history for the turning of our peoples back to faith and dependence on His strength. (Psalm 115)

#### A turn-around in the information war
